2016 DESIGN COMPETITION GUIDELINES

Qualified Projects

Qualified entries shall include any university project using either “in house” design and project coordination or outside architects and designers with university review and project coordination. Entries shall not have won previous AUID design competition awards. Entries must have been completed within two years of the competition date.

Entry Format

All entries shall be submitted using the PowerPoint template for the appropriate category. The templates are to be followed exactly. There are to be no embellishments, no photos of fabric samples, etc. In order to preserve anonymity with the judges, the identity of your institution should not be in your design statement or in the photos unless it is part of the project. Do not insert any additional photos!

Categories

- New Construction
- Renovation under \$50,000
- Renovation \$50,000 - \$150,000
- Renovation over \$150,000- \$500,000
- Renovation over \$500,000
- Specialty—no dollar restrictions
- Seriously!—just for fun

For the Specialty category, one to four photographs may be submitted. Entries might include signage, graphics, a custom rug design, millwork, an art panel, an unusual window treatment, a tile layout, etc.

The Seriously category was created to share the unexpected, unbelievable, crazy things we encounter daily.

Project Statement

Describe what you did in 100 words or less. The project statement should include your design intent. The photos you include should reinforce your design intent.

Photos

Each submission is allowed four photos only. Please do not insert additional photos! Please try to submit before and after photos that are taken from the same angle to give the judges a better idea of the final project installation. Your photos should represent your design intent!

Judging

Three judges are selected by the design committee of the annual conference and approved by the President of AUID. They shall be professional designers or architects, representative of the local design community, and shall not be affiliated with any of the entrants. A minimum of two entries per category must be submitted for a category to be judged. In the event that a project is unable to be judged in two consecutive years, it shall be awarded "Honorable Mention" to recognize the effort taken to resubmit.

Awards (Categories)

First, Second and Third Place will be awarded in the following categories:

- New Construction
- Renovation under \$50,000
- Renovation \$50,000 to \$150,000
- Renovation \$150,000- \$500,000
- Renovation over \$500,000
- Specialty – no dollar restrictions
- Seriously!

An overall "Best of Show" award will also be awarded.

It is up to the discretion of the judges whether all places will be awarded. Only one entry may be submitted per building/project.

To determine the category for each entry, summarize costs for the following:

Demolition/construction of walls

Finishes for the interior

Furniture for the interior

Accessories, artwork, lighting

Do not include interior design fees, architectural fees, asbestos abatement, HVAC, any costs not directly associated with the submitted project as it relates to interior design.

A detailed cost breakdown of the project, as well as furniture and finish sources, will be considered optional information. This is not required and will not influence judging but would be helpful information for interested members.
